BPI is a suite of tools allowing those involved in primary care to monitor and manage their progress towards agreed health goals. These targets may be clinically driven for quality of care or performance driven to maximise funding. Users are able to analyse patients by chronic condition, view current management of a patient group and provide exception reporting. This assists practices in reaching PPP targets by viewing their current status against the target, the number required to meet targets and provides a list of eligible patients. A recall can then be directly generated from within BPI to populate MS.

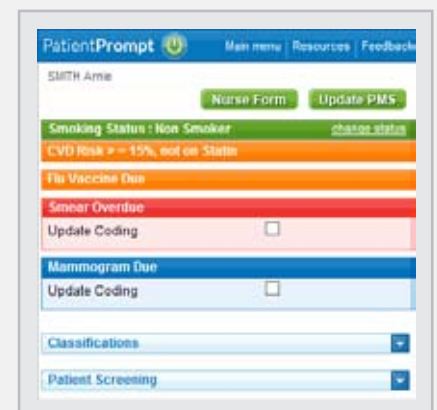
